Signage will indicate that the cameras are present. As you know security cameras are now part of our life. We are filmed at the shops, on the road, at the club and many other places. Security cameras have been in some schools for some time. I believe that the cameras will help us keep all at Holy Family safer. We will develop some privacy protocols around the use of the cameras. 
Fundraising News Christmas Hampers Raffle




Our final fundraising event for 2017 will be the Christmas Hamper Raffle.

- * Year 6—Bathroom






Your Prayers Please
