The Learning Corner

Literacy Learning at Holy Family

The Literacy Block occurs daily for a minimum of 100 minutes and consists of three components, that includes integration across other Key Learning Areas:

- ✓ Speaking and Listening
- ✓ Reading and Viewing
- ✓ Writing and Responding

What is Speaking and Listening?

Students in all classes participate in purposeful discussions about their learning with their peers. This involves both speaking about their learning and actively listening to others.

So how can you help? Speaking and listening to children does lots of important things. It improves your bond with them, and encourages them to listen to you. It helps them to form relationships and to build self-esteem.

Top tips for speaking and listening:

- ✓ Set aside time for talking and listening to each other.
- ✓ Let your child finish talking and then respond.
- ✓ Show your interest by saying such things as, 'Tell me more about ...', 'Really!'
- ✓ Ask your child questions that require more lengthy use of language. Encourage your child to tell you about events that did not involve you. This helps students work out what a listener needs to know and prepares them for writing.
- ✓ If you speak a language other than English at home, it is important that you continue to support your child in maintaining the home language. Being able to speak more than one language is a good thing.

The Numeracy Spot


Thank you to all the families who booked and attended a *Mathematics Assessment Interview* on January 29th. These interviews provide all students with an opportunity to share their mathematical strengths and areas of challenge. Everyone has now completed these interviews, and staff are planning learning experiences to cater for the needs of their students.

Our Numeracy Goal for 2019 at Holy Family is...

For all learners to improve by a minimum of one years growth in reasoning and additive strategies by receiving, responding to and giving feedback.

What does that involve?

- ✓ developing a range of mathematical strategies for solving problems involving addition and subtraction
- ✓ developing their ability to select more effective strategies to solve and prove their responses
- ✓ providing opportunities for students to work collaboratively, explaining and developing their thinking and learning from one another
- ✓ fostering a growth mindset that allows students to learn from their mistakes, by seeing these as opportunities to grow as mathematicians
- ✓ students listening and responding to both peer and teacher feedback



As learners, we are all different and develop skills and understanding at varying speeds and through a variety of ways. The staff at Holy Family acknowledge this and endeavour to support the students in all aspects of the learning.



Lent 2019


The Season of Lent is fast approaching with Ash Wednesday being the 6th of March. There will be a Liturgy in the hall that parents and relatives are most welcome to attend.

Lent is a season of penance, reflection and fasting traditionally observed by Catholics and some Protestant congregations to prepare us for Christ's Resurrection from the dead.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and ends just before the Mass of the Last Supper (Holy Thursday). Lent lasts for 40 days, (not counting Sundays). Lent began as a way for Catholics to remind themselves of the value of repentance and forgiveness.



In class, the students will be remembering the sacrifice that Jesus made for us and to think of ways that we can be more like him.
