In the 1st reading at church this week, we heard from Prophet Isaiah who challenges us to be 'giving'. Isaiah does this through creation, through the gift of life in which God has given each of us to use - 'anointed in Spirit - in 'life''.

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for the Lord has anointed me. He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to bind up hearts that are broken; to proclaim liberty to captives, And freedom to those in prison;



We are asked to start preparing the way for God to be present at Christmas. This I think can be extremely challenging, particularly with family. Often the deepest hurt we carry stems from our family relationships, because they are so dear and close to us, and we expect or want more. Christmas can be a very confronting time for adults and children alike. Children carry strong memories from these events and can pick up on the pain of those they are most closest to.

If there is a gift to be given at Christmas in order to impart happiness, it will not be found in a box, or in the form of a toy or in a PlayStation, or on Netflix. The gift will be found in relationships that bring about Joy. Here are some interpretations of what Isaiah speaks of;

bring good news to the poor,	Be joyful, be happy and be more loving to those around you, <u>especially those that struggle with this.</u>
bind up hearts that are broken;	Listen more and be more available and present. You don't need to offer a solution just actively hear.
proclaim liberty to captives,	Offer forgiveness be the first - you can't go wrong.
freedom to those in prison;	Give your TIME generously to those that are lonely.

Reading each day strengthens their ability! Practice makes perfect!



Executive Director's Summer Reading Challenge

This year the EDSRC is bigger than ever. Although not compulsory, we are encouraging children to enter the Challenge and there are some great prizes to be won! All children will be bringing home information about how they can enter the Challenge. We have also included that information, for you, in this newsletter. Reading regular books is recommended but your child is also able to borrow ebooks from LEX (Parramatta Diocese Learning Exchange) to do the Challenge. Access to this is through their student portal that is used everyday at school.

The Public Library

Access to most Public Libraries is free. Have you taken your child to your local public library? It's a great place for your child to go to get extra books over the holiday break. Public libraries also offer children's storytime, author talks, holiday activities and other events. Checkout Blacktown City Library on Google, your local library is Mount Druitt Branch Library. Well worth a visit!

Community Language Books

We have some very exciting news. The library has started collecting new collections of books in community languages, information books about the countries, cultures and stories of those languages. Languages include:

- Samoan
- NZ Maori
- Cook Island Maori
- Tongan
- Fijian

• Nigerian (books mainly in English but of Nigerian culture, history, geography, tribal groups, stories, food, etc)

- South Sudanese/Dinka
- Arabic

We are in the process of cataloguing the newly ordered books and hope to have them available for the start of the new school year in 2021. We think that there will be great excitement amongst the children about these.

Darug books

As with our community language books, we are also starting a specific collection of books in the local Darug language and about the local Darug country, customs, stories and laws. Any books by Darug authors, will also be included in the collection. As our school is situated in Darug heartland and we have a number of students who have Darug ancestry, it is vital that we collect and promote books in this field. We want our school library to be the custodian of as great a collection of Darug books as possible.

Wiradjuri Books

We have also started a Wiradjuri (area west of the Blue Mountains) Collection. We are hoping to be able to commence Wiradjuri language lessons for the children next year. A number of the Wiradjuri language books have been written by Stan Grant Snr, (Stan Grant the journalist's father), who is a Wiradjuri speaker and scholar! Again, we have students of Wiradjuri ancestry and the Wiradjuri language is still widely spoken today, so collecting Wiradjuri materials is deemed to be of high importance.

Donations from Marist College, Dundas

Marist College has given us hundreds of books that they no longer require. These books, we are giving to the children to take home and read and keep. There are some wonderful titles and the books are near new. If your child comes home with books with the Marist label on them, there is no need to return these to the library. They have been given to your child as a gift and for them to read and enjoy over the holidays


