

This coming Sunday marks the *Feast of Christ the King. The feast day always* occurs on the Sunday one week before the start of Advent (the time we prepare for Christmas).

OzHarvest Hamper Program - Re-funded!

We have some exciting news! In collaboration with OzHarvest, we have been able to secure a re-funding of the Food Hamper Program until Term 3 2021.

Each fortnight we are gifted with 100 hampers for our community. Each hamper provides a meal each night for one week for a family of four. For families over four, two hampers are provided. OzHarvest hampers are nutritional and consist of fresh fruit and vegetables, as well as non-perishable food items.

The hampers assist families in the School, Parish, Catholic Early Learning Centre, the Aboriginal Catholic Education Centre and the wider community in times of distress and need.

Remembrance Day Service


Last Wednesday Holy Family commemorated Remembrance Day. During the ceremony we were reminded of the sacrifice that others have given to bring us peace.

Staff Professional Development


Over the course of this year our staff have been working on a Formation Goal:

Is our school Welcoming?


