Message from the Principal

Greetings and welcome to our new school year

It was a pleasure watching the children return to school last week. So many of the children were happy to return to school to see their friends and teachers. Thank you parents for helping the children return to school with such a positive attitude and thirst for learning.

As you are aware we are still working with the Covid restrictions. Thank you parents for your assistance with the ongoing restrictions. We appreciate your support.

Our Beginning of the School Year Liturgy is next Wednesday. At this liturgy we will ask for God's blessing on our community as we begin another year of learning about our God, the world and ourselves. We will welcome our new students especially our new Kindergarten class and our new staff. We will also ask for God's blessing and guidance on our 2021 Student Leaders.

Unfortunately the COVID restrictions won't allow us to invite the school community. We will post lots of photos for you to see our liturgy.

Learning at Holy Family

Each year we have a major learning goal for students and staff. This year we are carrying over part of our goal from last year which was assisting students to be Assessment Capable Learners. This means we need to learn about how we learn, set goals and reflect and act on the feedback we get to help us extend our learning. To get started this year we are having a school wide focus on counting. Counting is the key conceptual idea on which other number concepts are based. Teachers are planning activities where students will improve understanding by using counting skills in a variety of meaningful situations. To know how the students are progressing teachers will monitor progress and give feedback to ensure students know their next step. It would be great if you could check in with your child each day and ask about them what they are learning about counting. I would like to hear what they tell you.

Our Newsletter

This is our first newsletter for the year. The newsletter usually goes out each fortnight on Thursdays in the even weeks of the term. The newsletter is also distributed electronically through the Skoolbag App. We have a handout if you want it showing how to set up the App.

Pupil Free Day

This day will be a pupil Free Day. I am sorry that this event is so close to the beginning of the school year. REMEMBER - Reflect on your experiences and events throughout your day.


NOTICE - What was your favourite and least favorite experience/s?

Literacy Corner

Dear Parents and Friends,

In 2021, Holy Family set a number of goals to achieve in areas of Formation, Literacy and Numeracy .We believe that all children can grow and succeed.

2021 Holy Family Goal: For all students to develop as assessment capable learners.

Put simply, assessment capable learners understand what they are supposed to learn, monitor their own progress, set goals, and reflect on their learning.



Educators who help their students become assessment capable learners have students who: know the learning target for a lesson, can describe where they are in relation to the criteria, and use that information to select learning strategies to improve their work.

Over the first few weeks of the school year, teachers have been collecting initial data on all of our students to assist them in the programming and planning of each and every child at Holy Family. Numeracy and Literacy Data walls are used so that all children can be tracked and monitored throughout the year. So how can you help your child develop as a lifelong learner? One way is to get them into a routine of reading everyday.

Tips for Making a Regular Time for Reading Every Day

- Turn off the T.V
- Let your child know that you enjoy the time together
- Make listening to reading a **special** time
- Your child will sense when listening to reading becomes boring for you
- Be seen as a reader yourself
- Encourage your child to make use of the local and school libraries.

School photography information:

- Online orders do not require an envelope returned to your school
- **Sibling Photos** Don't forget to pre-order your sibling photos online up to 24 hours before photo day. We provide your school with a list of sibling orders right up to the day of photography, so no one misses out. If you miss the online order deadline, you can submit a completed sibling order envelope first thing in the morning of the day of photography, so your school is aware you want the photo taken and can bring your children together in time for it. Sibling photographs only apply to children enrolled at your school. Please note not all schools offer sibling photos
- Late fees a late fee will be applied to each package purchased after photo day due to the additional cost of producing these packages separately
- **Package delivery** photographic packages will be returned to your school for distribution approximately six weeks after photos are taken
- **Previous Years' photos** Past years' photographs including sports, co-curricular and representative groups are also available to order under the 'previous years or group photo' tabs at your school's **advancedorder** site. You can also order past packages, portrait images and gifts from your child's unique, individual and secure **advancedyou** image archive site using the unique 9 digit image code found on packages you have ordered in the past


CHICKEN PATTIES 4 WAYS

Brekky Trifle: Layer it up!

Power pancakes: Add some cereal into your pancake mix to make your pancakes more exciting!




