
Literacy Corner

This term our Years 3 and 5 students will participate in the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) which is an annual assessment for all students in Australia. NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are already learning through the school curriculum.

How can you help your child prepare for the tests?

- Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep and eats a healthy breakfast
- Encouraging your child to read as much as possible, and to increase their vocabulary even reading magazines, newspapers, and comic books regularly will help improve reading skills
- Remain positive , staying calm will help your child stay calm

The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to reassure your child that NAPLAN tests are just one part of their school program, and to encourage them to simply do the best they can on the day.


NSW Premier's Reading Challenge
